Starting July 13, 2025, [postal service fees](#) will go up. It will be even more expensive to mail in person.

Certified Mail Labels charges \$9.11 for postage, electronic tracking, and signature confirmation. That's a savings of over \$1 per letter.

If you skip the signature, you pay only \$6.49. You still get proof of mailing and delivery, making it a wise choice for less formal mail.
