Worker injury rates hit alarming levels across American workplaces in 2023. Private companies reported [2.6 million work injuries](#) and illnesses, per the Bureau of Labor Statistics. Pennsylvania followed the national trend, reporting 115,200 nonfatal workplace injuries that year.

Nationwide, there were 5,283 fatal workplace injuries in 2023. In ***Pennsylvania alone, 169 workers lost their lives on the job in the same period.***

The industry also reported ***173,200 nonfatal occupational injuries and illnesses.*** Here are some **unsafe working conditions** examples in the construction industry:
